

# **NOT CONDEMNED**

Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those in Christ Jesus, because the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and death. What the law could not do since it was weakened by the flesh, God did. He condemned sin in the flesh by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh as a sin offering, in order that the law's requirement would be fulfilled in us who do not walk according to the flesh but according to the Spirit. [Romans 8:1-4]

If you are in Christ...

### 1) You are not condemned; Christ was condemned for you.

There is now no condemnation for those in Christ Jesus... [v.1]

He condemned sin in the flesh by sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh as a sin offering... [v.3]

### 2) You are declared perfect; Christ's perfection was given to you.

...in order that the law's requirement would be fulfilled in us... [v.4]

There's an old play on the word justified: "just-as-if-l'd never sinned." But here's another way of saying it: "just-as-if-l'd always obeyed." Both are true. The first refers to the transfer of our moral debt to Christ so we're left with a "clean" ledger, just as if we'd never sinned. The second tells us our ledger is now filled with the perfect righteousness of Christ, so it's just as if we'd always obeyed. [Jerry Bridges]
