Ron is a self-proclaimed "gusher"-a greeter and an usher. You can find him at most Saturday services welcoming people with a bulletin and a mint outside the south entrance to the Worship Center.

To some people he's known as "mint man" because he arrives early, circulating through the Worship Center offering anyone a mint. "I'm incredibly bashful," said Ron, "but when I get into the sanctuary it's a different thing. Everyone in the

sanctuary is there for the same purpose-to worship-and this gives me the confidence to talk to them." Ron knows what it's like to attend a new church and have no one say hello.

"Every person I see I tell them that I'm happy to see them. Nearly every person coming in is struggling with something. It's so gratifying to relieve a little hurt or frustration by recognizing them and talking to them for a few minutes. It's amazing how many people I greet that are in church for the first time. This makes the church personal. It touches their hearts and gets them ready to worship."

GOD'S PLAN FOR THE RICH

*Instruct those who are rich in the present age **not to be arrogant** or to set their hope on the uncertainty of wealth, but on God, who richly provides us with all things to enjoy. Instruct them to do what is good, to **be rich in good works**, to **be generous** and willing to share, storing up treasure for themselves as a good foundation for the coming age, so that they may take hold of what is truly life. (1 Timothy 6:17-19)*

1) Be humble.

Instruct those who are rich...not to be arrogant... (verse 17)

Riches and honor come from you, and you are the ruler of everything. (1 Chronicles 29:12a)

When you eat and are full, and build beautiful houses to live in, and your herds and flocks grow large, and your silver and gold multiply, and everything else you have increases, be careful that your heart doesn't become proud and you forget the Lord your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the place of slavery... You may say to yourself, "My power and my own ability have gained this wealth for me," but remember that the Lord your God gives you the power to gain wealth... (Deuteronomy 8:12-14; 17-18a)

- **Humbly set your hope on God.**

Instruct those who are rich...not to set their hope on the uncertainty of wealth, but on God. (verse 17)

- **Humbly enjoy what God provides.**

...on God, who richly provides us with all things to enjoy. (verse 17)

2) Be rich in good works.

Instruct them to do what is good, to be rich in good works... (verse 18)

3) Be generous.

Don't store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves don't break in and steal. (Matthew 6:19-20)

Now about the collection for the saints: Do the same as I instructed the Galatian churches. On the first day of the week, each of you is to set something aside and save in keeping with how he is prospering, so that no collections will need to be made when I come. (1 Corinthians 16:1-2)
