main point

Jesus first invited His disciples to "come and see" but after years with Him, He left them with the message to "go and make." The simple statement is profound, rooted in the first command God gave humanity—to be fruitful and multiply image-bearers. Now, we are invited to be fruitful and multiply—to take the gospel to people from every nation so they are re-made by the One who has re-made us.

16 The eleven disciples traveled to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had directed them. 17 When they saw him, they worshiped, but some doubted.

18 Jesus came near and said to them, "All authority has been given to me in heaven and on earth. 19 Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 teaching them to observe everything I have commanded you.

And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Read John 1:38-39

38 When Jesus turned and noticed them following him, he asked them, “What are you looking for?”

They said to him, “Rabbi” (which means “Teacher”), “where are you staying?”

39 “Come and you’ll see,” he replied. So they went and saw where he was staying, and they stayed with him that day...
