WEEK 7: REJOICE IN YOUR SPOUSE NOT "VARIETY IS THE SPICE OF LIFE."

GROUP DISCUSSION GUIDE

PREPARE

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MAIN POINT

The head of sales of Ashley Madison, the website designed to connect cheating spouses, said their biggest competitor was the Bible. The world gives you clichés like "it is just sex," and "you only live once," and "variety is the spice of life," encouraging people to find thrills and sex outside of their marriages. Proverbs 5:1-14 gives the warning about adultery and how it can ruin you and everything. But verses 15-20 give us the way to avoid adultery—by rejoicing in the spouse of your youth and allowing her/him to be the only cistern we drink from. In the Scripture, married couples are challenged to rejoice in each other fully, including physically. Singles are given a vision of sex within marriage that is better and better for them.

LOOK DOWN LOOK AT GOD'S WORD

Read Proverbs 5:15-20

15 Drink water from your own cistern,water flowing from your own well.16 Should your springs flow in the streets,streams in the public squares?

17 They should be for you alone and not for you to share with strangers.
18 Let your fountain be blessed, and take pleasure in the wife of your youth.
19 A loving deer, a graceful doe—let her breasts always satisfy you; be lost in her love forever.
20 Why, my son, would you lose yourself with a forbidden woman or embrace a wayward woman?

In Proverbs 5:15-20, what imagery does Solomon use to describe marital faithfulness?

What does it mean to "rejoice in the wife of your youth" (v. 18), and how does this apply to long-term commitment?

In Proverbs 5:20, Solomon writes, "Why, my son, would you lose yourself with a forbidden woman or embrace a wayward woman?" What does that practically look like today?
